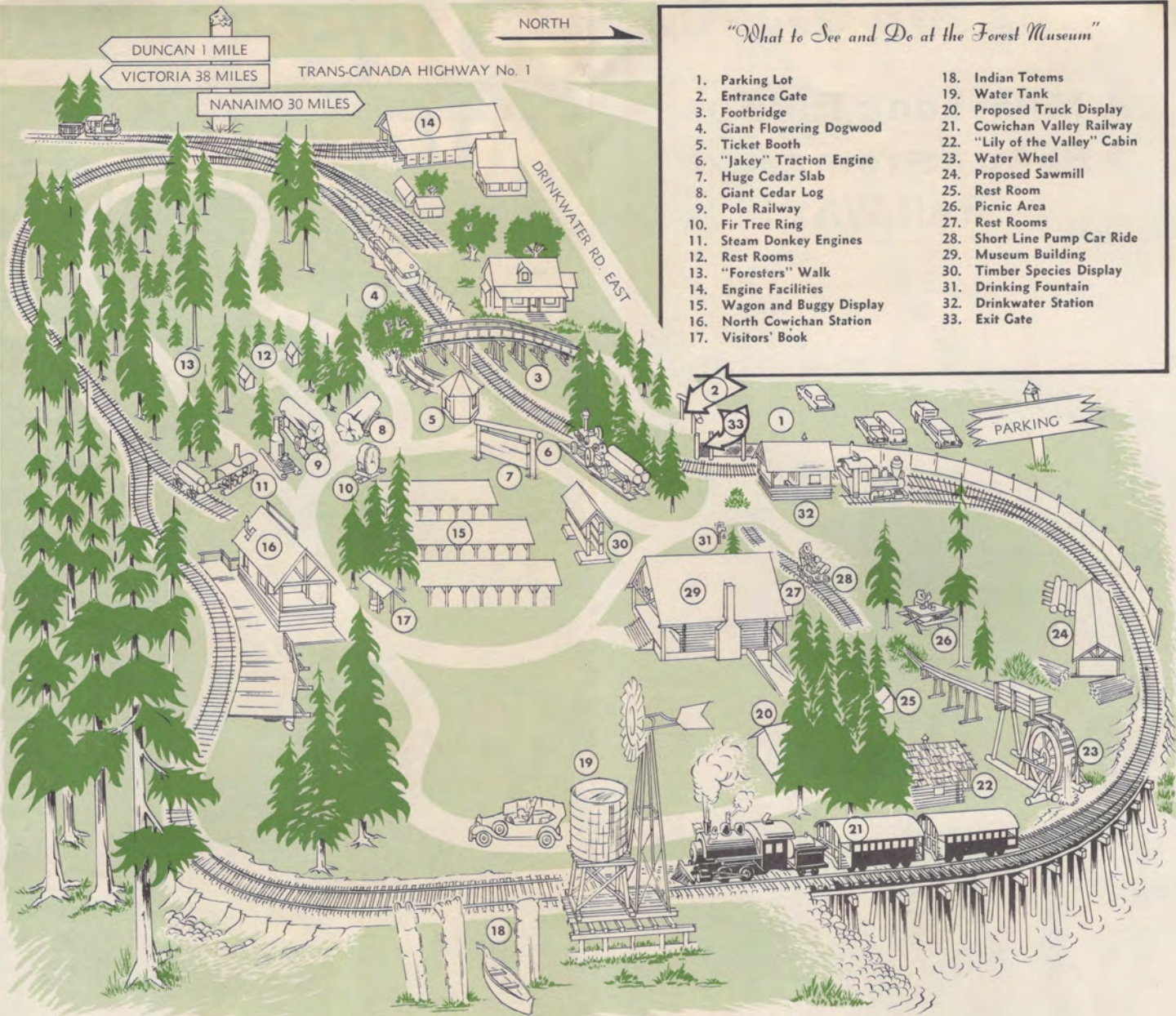

YOU CAN SEE Douglas Fir trees, five feet in diameter and 180 feet tall, which were already 100 years old when Capt. James Cook made his first voyage to Vancouver Island in 1778.

YOU CAN RIDE on a mile-long, narrow-gauge railway, winding through the trees, over fills and under bridges, and crossing a bay on Somenos Lake upon a 300-foot trestle.



YOU CAN HEAR the whistling and the puffing of some of the few remaining steam logging locomotives.
